#### **Explanation enhanced statutory fee smallscale studyprogramme**

The Gerrit Rietveld Academie is allowed to set the statutory fee at a higher level based on the "Distinctive feature of small-scale and intensive education", awarded in 2013 by the Dutch-Flemish Accreditation Council (NVAO). The enhanced statutory fee is already included in the above rate.

This enhanced statutory fee enables the academy to provide students with an intensive, smallscale, international studyprogramme with a strong focus on the individual student. By handling a relatively limited raise for the majority of the students (the group that is allowed to pay the statutory fee), the institutional fee can remain relatively low. This way, the academy aims to lower the bar for the minority of the students (non-EU/EEA nationality or students with a Dutch Bachelor degree) who have to pay the institutional fee.
